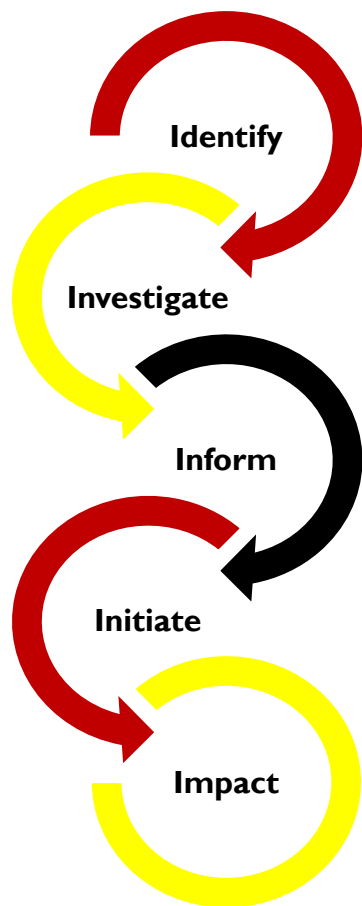




Careers Strategy 2019



Identify

Students will identify their own strengths, personal traits and interests in relation to a potential future career.

Investigate

Students will begin to investigate what the world of work has to offer, current labour market information and what employability skills they will need to develop for a successful, fulfilling career.

Inform

Students will begin to use information they have explored and enable themselves to make informed decisions about their future studies.

Initiate

Students will prepare themselves for future success by developing employability skills, whilst considering post-16 options.

Impact

Students will be proactive in making applications to various learning providers/employers for their next steps.
