urban (towns and cities)

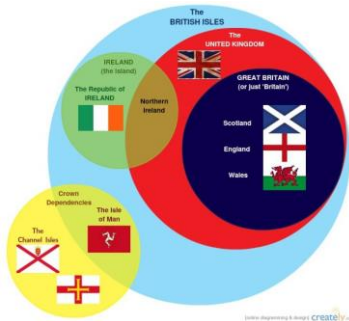
