<p><b>The CLOCCC location of the United Kingdom is</b>  <b>Continent</b> – Europe  <b>Latitude</b> - 55°N 0°W  <b>Oceans and seas</b> – North Sea, Irish Sea, English Channel, Atlantic Ocean  <b>Countries</b> – France to the south, Republic of Ireland to the west, mainland Europe and Asia to the east, the Arctic Ocean to the north  <b>Compass Direction</b> – Northern Hemisphere  <b>Climate</b> – Temperate Maritime</p>	<p><b>Use CLOCC to describe the location of the UK</b></p>
<p><b>The British Isles</b> refers to the islands of Great Britain and Ireland – including the Republic of Ireland – and the 5000 or so smaller islands scattered around our coasts  <b>Great Britain</b> refers to the land occupied by the nations of England, Scotland, and Wales  <b>Ireland</b> refers to the land occupied by the nations of the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland  <b>The United Kingdom is made up of 4 nations:</b>            England            Scotland            Wales            Northern Ireland  <b>The capital cities of each of the 4 UK nations:</b>            England – London            Scotland – Edinburgh            Wales – Cardiff            Northern Ireland – Belfast  <b>Each nation is divided further</b>            Nations → Regions → Counties → Districts  <b>Regions</b> are smaller parts of a nation e.g., North-East, West Midlands  <b>Counties</b> are smaller parts of regions e.g., Kent, Surrey, Cornwall  <b>Districts</b> are smaller parts of counties e.g., Dartford, Ashford, Maidstone</p>	<p><b>State</b> which nations form part of The British Isles, Great Britain, and the United Kingdom  <b>Identify</b> the capital cities of each of the four nations</p>
<p><b>London, the capital city of England and the United Kingdom is so large it is divided up even further into 32 boroughs</b>            The boroughs nearest to our school are Bromley, Bexley, Lewisham, and Greenwich  <b>London</b> is located in the southeast of England and is located around the river Thames            The <b>river Thames</b> flows from its source (start) to its mouth (end) from west to east. The river Thames source is in <b>Gloucestershire</b> and its mouth is between <b>Whitstable in Kent</b> and <b>Foulness Point in Essex</b>            The city of London began in <b>Roman times</b> as they were able to make use of the <b>fresh water, crossing points</b> and <b>trade routes</b> of the river Thames            Many people over the years have <b>migrated</b> (moved) to live in London from across the United Kingdom and the rest of the world for some of the following reasons:            education, safety, healthcare, climate, food security, housing, employment, family            Some of the <b>problems</b> that London faces are:            traffic congestion, pollution, housing costs, Overcrowding  <b>National Parks</b> are areas of land that are protected by law for the benefit of the nation.
