Y9's DTP/MEN vaccination

Parents <u>must</u> complete the consent form using this link regardless of them consenting or declining the vaccine. Vaccinations will take place by NHS Staff on site on Friday 25 February 2022 and the link for consent will close one week before this to allow time to process.

Expectations

I have today delivered assemblies to every year group with regard to respect and the College's expectations. You will remember that when your child joined the College, all parties had to sign up to Home/School Agreement. I firmly believe that in order to provide a high quality education students have to take responsibility for their own actions and behaviour. During the assembly, I reiterated our stance on the uniform policy. If students are not in the correct uniform, then they will have the opportunity to "loan" the item from the school. If students fail to comply, then parents will be contacted so that arrangements can be made for students to go home and rectify their uniform. Failure to obtain parental consent will result in students placed in the Internal Exclusion Unit. I ask that parents support us with this and check your child is in the correct uniform before they leave for school. For ease of information, I attach our Uniform Policy.

During the assembly, students were reminded of the College's Mobile Phone and Behaviour Policies. Staff have been instructed to confiscate any phone that is "out" and visible in school. Phones should be in bags or blazers and most importantly, out of sight. Also, I spoke to students about how everyone deserves to be treated with respect and to be aware how they speak to staff and others.

We have a small minority of students that are persistently late to lessons. This is having a detrimental impact on their learning and also extremely unfair as it disrupts the learning of others. Parents of this small group of students will be notified and if it does not improve, further sanctions will be imposed.

I am very mindful of the fact that children have been out of school for long periods of time due to Covid and being placed in "bubbles" impacted them in being able to socially interact with each other and also play and just have fun together. I do believe that they should have more social time together so it is for that reason I have decided to trial an extended lunch break. Our long term plan is to rollout lunch time extra-curricular clubs so that students enjoy a longer time with their friends and the possibility of learning new skills. This will also benefit the school in the short term as we manage staff absences and shortages. You will know that it is always a last resort to close year groups to manage staff absences.

Mental Health

You will know from previous letters that the College works very closely with "Bromley Y" who promote the emotional wellbeing and mental health of children, young people and families. Due to the success of previous webinars, Bromley Y have organised further webinars for pupils and parents. These include: -

- Webinar Emotion Based School Avoidance in Children and Young People.
 This is primarily for parents and carers and looks at understanding school avoidance in young people and ways to manage this. The webinar can be accessed by signing up via EventBrite. Sessions will take place on Friday 4 February, 1:00pm 2:30pm and Tuesday 8 March 10:30am 12noon
- Webinar Exam Stress: Developing Healthy Study Habits.
 This is suitable for any pupil in Years 10 to 13 and can be accessed by signing up via EventBrite. Sessions will take place on Wednesday 16 February, 1:00pm 2pm and Tuesday 15 March, 4:30pm 5:30pm
- The Signpost: Text Service
 The Signpost' is a great way for 11 18yrs to get quick access to a Bromley Y practitioner. Texts are responded to within 24hrs and give support, containment and advice. The service can be used for young people who have already been referred to the service and those who have not.
- Webinars for Parent/Carers and Young People continue to run on a monthly basis and have dates arranged through till March 2022.

He did this in order to raise awareness for Shout which is a mental health text service charity. Not only did Leo raise nearly £8,000 for the charity, he also met with the Duchess of Cambridge who congratulated him on his achievement.
