E A S T E R R E A D I N G S C H O O L







Kemnal Geographers have made the most of the fine weather recently and our spacious outside areas and have spent several lessons carrying out investigations and practising our fieldwork skills.



Hopefully, with the new term from September onwards, the Geography department will begin to take our students further afield to complete fieldwork, to bring to life the learning that happens in the classroom.




