




CYBER BULLYING KS3 ASSEMBLY





What is Cyber bullying?

Cyber bullying is <u>bullying</u> that takes place using electronics technology.

Electronic technology includes devices such as; smart mobile phones, computers, tablet as well as communication tools including social media sites, text messages, chat, online gaming and websites.







Examples of Cyber bullying?












Posting upsetting or offensive messages about someone online such as:

- Nasty rumours sent by email, text on social networking sites e.g. Facebook,, Twitter.
- Uploading rude pictures, videos, or creating a fake profiles about someone.
- > Sending sexist, homophobic and racist messages.
- Name calling and general insults using a mobile phone.

Remember: It's against the law to bully someone in this way and if someone is being mean or threatening you, something can be done to stop them.



How can 1 get away from them?

Steps to take if you're being bullied online

- 1. Tell an adult you can trust for e.g. parents, carers, Teacher, to help support you.
- 2. Don't reply or forwarded any messages you received, as this may encourage the bullies.
- 3. Keep a copy of the abusive emails, texts or messages that you received and when they were sent to you, for evidence.
- 4. Report nasty messages to the website you have found them on. Use the website report button.
- 5. Block the person who is cyber bullying you.


