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## What happens when a **ClickCEOP** report is sent?

Child contacted by a Child Protection Advisor (CPA) — specialist social worker.

CPA - designed to safeguard, support and reassure

CEOP seeks parental involvement — unless there are safeguarding concerns there

## What happens when a **ClickCEOP** report is sent?

CEOP is a law enforcement agency — reporting is like reporting to police

Child empowered to make a 'police statement' — but never pressured to

Often voluntary agencies get involved afterwards to work with children moving forward

## Video



**Skype**  
Skype is a computer programme and app, which lets you make audio and video calls to friends and family.



**Vine**  
Vine is an app that lets you share 6 second videos that play on a loop. You can repost videos and leave comments.



**Facetime**  
Facetime is video calls over Wi-Fi from your iPhone, iPad, iPod touch or Mac. You can even make Facetime calls over mobile networks on iPhone or iPad.




**Omegle**  
Talk to Strangers! Omegle randomly connects you to another person who's on the site, and lets you talk to them in a one-to-one video chat.



**Chatroulette**  
Chatroulette is a website which lets you talk to another person via a webcam another in the world.

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## Video (Live Streaming)




**Twitch**  
Twitch is a live video game website. You can watch playbacks of games being played by other people. You can also live stream your own games, and chat to other gamers.



**You Now**  
Tap 'Go Live' and you're on! Broadcast to a live audience, expand your social media following, comment on videos and buy virtual gifts




**Periscope**  
Owned by Twitter, Periscope is a live video streaming app. Allows you to send direct live video feeds to your Twitter followers




**Meerkat**  
Meerkat is a live-streaming app where streams are pushed to followers in real time via push notifications. Everything is live. Offers a leader-board

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## Social Networks




**Facebook**  
Facebook is the biggest social network, which lets users create a page about themselves.



**Tumblr**  
Tumblr is a social networking site and blogging site that lets you share text, photos, quotes, audio clips and videos.




**Twitter**  
Twitter is a social network messaging service that lets you send public message called 'tweets'.




**Skout**  
Skout is a simple social networking site an app, which you can use to connect with people worldwide.

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
## Social Networks (Pictures)




**Snapchat**  
Snapchat is an app that lets you send a photo or short video to your friends. The 'snap' appears on screen for a matter of seconds before disappearing.



**PopJam**  
PopJam is a creative website for children and young people. You can share drawings, photos and audio messages with friends and other people.



**Flickr**  
Flickr is an online photo sharing site. You can share your own pictures and follow other people.



**Instagram**  
Instagram is a picture and video sharing app. Users can post content and use hashtags to share experiences, thoughts or memories with an online community.

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## Anonymous



**Ask.fm**  
Ask.fm is a social networking site where you can ask other people questions. It's up to you whether you want to ask the question anonymously or not.



**Whisper**  
Whisper is a social network where you can remain anonymous, publish text and receive replies from other people. It also allows you to communicate with others through private messages.




**Yik Yak**  
Yik Yak is an online bulletin board. It uses the GPS settings on your mobile phone or tablet to find your location and show you the most recent posts from other people around you.




**Secret**  
Secret is a social networking app where you can post content or content anonymously.

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
## Online Dating




**Tinder**  
Tinder is a dating app, which has two separate communities - one for adults (18+) and one for young people aged 13-17. You're shown other people's profile pictures and you swipe left for 'no' or right for 'yes'.



**MeetMe**  
MeetMe is a social network and dating site which allows users to meet and communicate with other people worldwide.



**Snog**  
Snog is a teen dating site that lets you rate other people's profiles as snog, marry or avoid. You can also send private messages.



**MyLOL**  
MyLOL is a dating site for teenagers aged 13-20, but some users are up to 25 years old. Like an adult dating site, you can view other people's profiles and search for others based on their age, gender and location.

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## Secret Folders



**Calculator%**  
Calculator% hides private photos and videos behind a calculator. Anyone who starts this application looks as a calculator but if you put in passcode it will open up private area.



**Private Photo Vault**  
Private Photo Vault locks your photos and videos behind a pin. Keeps your photos etc. hidden from others.



**Secret Piano**  
Secret Piano hides photos, videos, passwords, notes, audios, locations and secret messages behind a real piano. The app will capture photo and video of intruders if they attempt to access it.



**Secret Folder App**  
Secret Folder App helps you to protect your photos and videos in a secure place with a very discreet lock type. No one can enter except those who know the passcode.

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## Online grooming: The five stages

### Friendship

**Flattering a child**

into talking in a private chatroom/game where they will be **isolated**

The child will often be asked for a **non-sexual picture of themselves**

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## Online grooming: The five stages

### Forming a relationship

2

#### Gaining information

asking the child what problems /needs they have to create the illusion of being their best friend and that they can help  
They begin to fill the needs of the child

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## Online grooming: The five stages

### Risk assessment

3

Asking the child about the location of their computer/tablet and who else has access to it  
in order to assess the risk of being detected. The desire is to create situations where they are alone together  
to help reinforce a special connection

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## Online grooming: The five stages

### Exclusivity

4

Building up a sense of mutual love and trust with the child  
suggesting that they can discuss "anything"

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## Online grooming: The five stages

### Sex talk

5

Engaging the child in explicit conversations & requesting sexually explicit pictures from them

At this stage the predator will usually try to

**arrange a meeting with the child**

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## So who are these 'sexual predators'...?

We should try to avoid using the term  
'paedophile' to mean  
**"all sexual predators of children"**

**Paedophile** = attracted to pre-pubescent children

**Hebephile** = attracted to children aged 11 - 14 years

**Infantophile** = attracted to babies and infants

## What are the risks for disabled youngsters using the Internet?



Disabled youngsters may not recognise risks  
and dangers of sharing information online



Educating disabled youngsters about  
safety could be more complicated



The computer can be a great leveller –  
allowing isolated youngsters to feel safe  
and involved



Disability isn't visible but may become  
apparent / or not

## cyberbullying

Cyberbullying is when someone bullies others over the internet or on a mobile phone by sending abusive emails or texts directly or by posting nasty comments or humiliating images for others to see. Like any form of bullying, cyberbullying can be terrible for the children involved and hard for them to talk about.

24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year

No safe place, hard to escape

Doesn't empathise with victim

Bully can be anonymous

Easily shared with an audience and has the ability to go viral in seconds

## cyberbullying

What should I do if my child is being bullied online?

Stay calm

Listen without judging

Tell them you can help

Praise them for talking to you

Keep the evidence

Block the bullies

Ask them not to reply

Report information to your child's school.

Children who **post or send indecent images of themselves online** are very easily **blackmailed / exploited** - as young as **eight years old**

‘Kids ‘sext’ to.....**show off**, to entice someone, to show interest in someone, or to **prove commitment**.’


By creating, sending or possessing indecent pictures of a **person under 18** you are **breaking the law**.  
(Protection of Children Act 1978 / Criminal Justice Act 1988)

**Sexting boy's naked selfie recorded as crime by police**

10:15pm 10th October 2014


A boy who sent a naked photograph of himself to a girl at school has had the crime of sending and distributing, received images recorded against him by police, the BBC has heard.

The boy, aged 14, was sent to court on charges of sending and distributing indecent images to a girl at school.


Police have only recently started filing **crime reports** about sexting...

If **school** choose to take an incident **to the police**, then officers must **record the crime**.

Make sure that your policies, practices and procedures have been updated to reflect how you will handle and prevent incidents

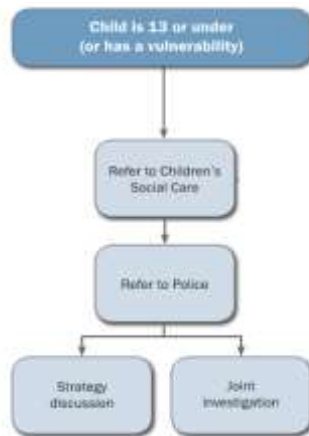

In a statement, her mother Sarah said...

**"She was in the clutches of a toxic digital world... where in the final few weeks we could no longer reach her"**

The review said that **healthcare professionals and educators had a responsibility to "gain better understanding" of the importance of online life for young people after deciding that the teenager had taken her own life.**

**"Tumblr is deeply committed to protecting our users' freedom of expression, but we draw lines around a few categories of content we consider damaging to our community, including blogs that encourage self-harm."**
