- Mozart: Concerto for Bassoon in B flat major, KV. 191 (also includes full orchestra)
- Dvořák: II. Largo "From the New World" Symphony No.9 (features the Cor Anglais)
- The Stereophonics: Handbags and Gladrags (listen out for the Oboe)
- John Grant: Down Here (features the Bass Clarinet)


