At this point in the play the bodies of Romeo and Juliet have been discovered.

	<b>CAPULET</b> O brother Montague, give me thy hand: This is my daughter's jointure, for no more Can I demand.
5	<b>MONTAGUE</b> But I can give thee more: For I will raise her statue in pure gold; That while Verona by that name is known, There shall no figure at such rate be set As that of true and faithful Juliet.
10	<b>CAPULET</b> As rich shall Romeo's by his lady's lie; Poor sacrifices of our enmity!
15	<b>PRINCE</b> A glooming peace this morning with it brings; The sun, for sorrow, will not show his head: Go hence, to have more talk of these sad things; Some shall be pardon'd, and some punished: For never was a story of more woe Than this of Juliet and her Romeo.
